

Registered 1999 Bayside Farm / Roger and Louise Mullen Circa 1850



This home was originally owned by the Sabean family. Dan Sabean may have built the home or it may have been constructed by his father, Willoughby Sabean. Research indicates that the home was built prior to 1872. Dan Sabean sold the property to Gilbert Lent in 1872.

Gilbert's son, Fred Lent, started the "Bayside Farm" which was a popular spot for tourists in the first half of the twentieth century. The farm consisted of five rooms upstairs and four cabins on the premises. One feature the farm offered to visitors was a gravity fed fountain located in the front yard of the property. In the winter, Fred would place a tree in the fountain and the ice would freeze over the tree forming a beautiful intricate ice sculpture. This would attract people from far away.

Today, Bayside Farm is owned by Roger and Louise Mullen. Together they have renovated the property to make it comfortable year round and have restored the property to its former grandeur.
