### The Elder Transcripts

#### BOWERS ELECTED DIGBY COUNTY IS LIBERAL

The agony is over and Mr. Bowers is elected.

The great deal of interest centered in this contest, not only because of the strong lines between the parties, but also on account of the personality of the 2 candidates. Both men had many close personal friends throughout the county, and both depended on their friends support. We never doubted the results, as we felt that once the people of Digby county began to realize the advantages that would accrue from freer trade relations with the United States, we might look for a change in public sentiment. That change has taken place, and if we look over the returns from the various polling districts, we will find the majority for Mr. Bowers increasing in proportion to the trade which those districts have with the United States. For instance Plympton, which has always gone strongly Conservative, gives Mr. Jones only 18 majority, while those towns on the Neck which do a considerable coasting trade have nearly all increased Liberal majorities.
