

Registered 2000 - St. Peter's Anglican Church - Circa 1879



The original St. Peter's Church was constructed around 1790 shortly after the loyalists arrived in Weymouth. Noted British Officer of the American Revolution, Colonel James Moody, donated the land and was one of the original trustees.

Over time, the original church became too small for the community so it was decided to build a larger, grander church in 1879. One unique feature is that the interior roof of the church resembles the hull of a ship with large oak ribs arched to the peak. This feature reflects the importance the sea had on this community. Large stained glass windows depicting significant biblical themes adorn all sides of this elegant church. St. Peter's is a fine example of the gothic style of that period with a steep pitched roof and arched windows. The church remains mainly unchanged from its original construction and stands as a tribute to the community.
