

Registered 1999 - Weymouth Historical Society/St. Thomas Church - Circa 1864



The St. Thomas Anglican Church was built by the people of Weymouth Bridge in 1864 as a sister parish to St. Peter's Church in Weymouth North. Members who lived in the Weymouth Bridge area could travel to St. Thomas Church much easier than the long trek to Weymouth North.

The church steeple still has the fine details of a gothic tower. The large entablatures leading to wide corner boards are more characteristic of classical revival design. The windows are capped with prominent arches expressing the gothic style which is the dominant overall style of St. Thomas Church. This church is a fine example of elaborate architecture from our past. Through the efforts of the Weymouth Historical Society, this building has been preserved as a reminder of the craftsmanship these buildings represent.
